By the time you read this, a whole bunch of ACA members and friends should be whooping it up at DRR IV at Quartzsite. In fact, I hope you're reading this Newsletter along with the rest of us by the light of the giant campfire in the Arizona desert. If not, I trust you'll be able to attend some or all of the other great rallies we have scheduled for 2005.

For example...in order to keep things interesting, we've added a "twist" to an already scheduled Rally. We have made arrangements for an **ACA Pre-Pre Rally** at the famous **Cheyenne Frontier Days Rodeo** in Cheyenne Wyoming.

We'll go by boat to Savannah, GA and tour the city on historic trolleys...there will be an expanded "Gearhead Session" and a ladies luncheon. Join us in this luxurious and historic setting.

And, we'll conclude the Rally year with a traditional "**Homecoming Rally**" in **Toppenish, WA**. Save the **October 4-9** dates for this fun and information-filled event.

TRAVEL TIPS

Cream Those Stains

Here's a simple (and cheap) way to clean most dirt and stains from window shades. You will find it works on most fabrics.

Buy the least-expensive shaving cream you can find and apply the cream to the shade or material; then, brush firmly into the stain (use a soft brush on soft materials and a stiff brush on heavier materials, like carpets), let it set and, once, dry, vacuum away the residue. On older stains, a second treatment might be necessary. I tried this myself on the blind in the galley and it worked!

TECH TIPS

Heat Ducts

On most models, but not all, there is a possibility of getting poor air circulation to your bedroom heat registers. The duct meant to carry the heated air to this area is chaffed and punctured. If the duct is not being secured with some type of hanger, it is hanging down on the sway bar over the rear axle. It might be a good idea to check this out. I found this on my 36 ft. coach.

Radiator Antifreeze

If you don't already know it, the coolant (antifreeze mix) in your engine radiator should be changed every 2 years even if you have kept yours up to par through the 2 year span. This is a suggestion from Cummins.

 - 2. SOUND AN ALARM! ALERT OTHERS! YELL FOR HELP! OPTIONS: TURN ON COACH HEADLIGHTS & EMERGENCY FLASHERS. USE TOAD KEY FOB ALARM. USE AN EMERGENCY WHISTLE.**
 - 3. IN CASE OF FIRE/SMOKE OR ALARMS FROM CO OR LPG DETECTORS EVACUATE COACH. DO NOT RE-ENTER THE COACH UNTIL CLEAR.**

NEWSLETTER DELIVERY
