## TRAVEL TIPS

---

### In Case of an Emergency - ICE

Paramedics will turn to a victim's cell phone for clues to that person's identity. You can make their job much easier with a simple idea that they are trying to get everyone to adopt: ICE.

ICE stands for In Case of Emergency. If you add an entry in the contacts list in your cell phone under ICE, with the name and phone number of the person that the emergency services should call on your behalf, you can save them a lot of time and have your loved ones contacted quickly. It only takes a few moments of your time to do.

Paramedics know that ICE means and they look for it immediately. Use ICE1, ICE2, etc., for more than one contact.

ICE you cell phone NOW!

## TECH TIPS

### Tire News:

I have just been introduced to what I think is a new accessory for tubeless tires when EQUAL is used for balancing. The product is a valve core that replaces the existing core. What this boils down to is a filter type valve core you install in your present valve stems and it keeps the balancing (sand) from coming out when you check your air pressure, which sometimes will keep the core from sealing the valve stem and can cause air loss and sometimes a flat tire. I have a few sets of these cores. If there is a lot of interest in these cores I can get more. The cost is \$1.00 each.
