We've changed the name for the annual ACA October Rally beginning with the October 2006 Nashville Rally. "**Heritage Rally**" more clearly represents the format of this annual event and will allow us to reprise the "Homecoming" name when we truly return *home* to the Yakima area.

The "Heritage Rallies" will endeavor to showcase America's unique and memorable locations or events. The **2006 Nashville Heritage Rally** is the first such destination. In October 2007 we will participate in the **Balloon Festival in Albuquerque, NM** and in November 2008 we will return to **Branson, MO** to enjoy the all-new **Holiday Shows**. "**Homecoming**" and a return to the Yakima-area and the WRV factory are on tap for Fall of 2009.

Just added to the lineup for the October **Nashville Heritage Rally** is a visit and tour of the **Corvette Assembly Plant** in Bowling Green, KY. We will tour the factory in the morning...break for a catered lunch... participate in a professional "**Gearhead Session**"...and then tour the **National Corvette Museum** before returning to the Nashville KOA for the night. We also have musical entertainment booked for Nashville as well as a visit to **The Grand Ole Opry**.

We're all aware that fuel costs are becoming a factor for many ACA members. Therefore, we will continue to work to keep all of the National Rallies scheduled 2-3 years in advance. This will allow

you to economically plan your travel and allow as many people as possible to include ACA National Rallies in their itineraries. Advance scheduling will also encourage all ACA Chapters to set their individual Rally schedules so as to not overlap national events.

The next 2006 Rally on the schedule is the Charlotte Pre-Rally...August 8-13...at Forest Lake Thousand Trails. The **2006 Nashville Heritage Rally** is scheduled for October 3-8, 2006.

We'll kick off 2007 with the traditional **Desert Rat Rally (DRR VI)** at Quartzsite, AZ. The Rally dates are January 18-23. March 13-18, 2007 we'll gather at the **Hilton Head, NC Outdoor Resorts** for the Perry, GA Pre-Rally. For August 7-12, 2007 we've selected the **Pacific Shores Outdoor Resorts** at Newport, OR for an oceanfront Pre-Rally ahead of the Redmond, OR FMCA National Convention. The **Albuquerque Balloon Festival "Heritage Rally"** is scheduled for October 9-13, 2007. And...we'll celebrate the beginning of 2008 with January's DRR VII in Arizona.

Nashville Registration materials should be in the mail about the time you receive this Newsletter and DRR VI materials should reach you in October.

Remember...there will be ACA General Membership meetings held at the Nashville Heritage Rally (with the installation of new ACA Board Members) and at DRR VI.

TECH TIPS

Go With the Flow

For a long time I have been trying to come up with a way to add bleach to my RV's water tank (to clean and purify the water system). There really is no way to "inject" bleach or water freshener, and filling the water hose - then trying to connect it to the water inlet - can turn into a mess. I found that a Miracle-Gro sprayer is just the thing. All I had to do to make it work for RV use was to re-drill the input hole (in the bottom of the cap) to match the output hole. When you purchase a Miracle-Gro sprayer, the input hole is only 1/16th inch in diameter (to mix the chemical fertilizer at a set rate). Since we want to get the bleach or water freshener in as soon as possible, increasing the size of the input hole does the trick. Then, just fill the bowl with bleach or baking soda, and fill 'er up. It can even be put between two hoses or attached directly to the RV water inlet.

If you have any suggestions or problems you have solved on your own, please send them to me and I will see that they get printed in this column, which could benefit other members.
